Our top priority is to facilitate classes in a safe environment for both teacher and learners.

The students returned to classes after a week's school holiday at the end of September. After the excitement of the Montagu Youth Arts Festival held in mid September it was now back to basics for our students. Nqaba Mafilika continued to teach with Aviwe November assisting and teaching as well. Aviwe has also choreographed a new piece which is proving to be a challenge for the students. However, with persistent rehearsals the necessary technique required will be achieved.

I would like to thank Lihle Mfene for being so very helpful in arranging this for us. Lihle was one of our former students and is now dancing with the Cape Town City Ballet who are performing The Nutcracker this Christmas season.

Finally, I must mention and report that Aviwe November has been with us for three months on a trial period and I am glad to say that he will be joining the team as from the 1st of November 2024. Aviwe has built up a lot of experience as both a professional dancer and a teacher. We hope to welcome him on board as soon as the contract has been finalized and signed.

All has been going well this month. The students are coming in pleasing numbers. Having Aviwe has been going well and he has some nice work up his sleeve so I can't wait to see the students performing his ballets. We are so looking forward to performing in McGregor next month where rehearsals are going well and miss Mary is thrilled with the energy that the students have displayed, Dancescape students are doing 4 numbers in that event. The school exams are also taking place, but we are still having a huge turnout for classes and training the students, focusing on fine tuning the technique side.
