The Dancescape South Africa Report for January 2025

Dancescape South Africa (DSA) continues to facilitate daily dance classes in January of 2025 (2.00pm – 6.00pm Venue Zolani Hope Centre – Mantlane Road Zolani Ashton) engaging children in beginner and senior dance sessions. We currently employ the services of a resident teacher, an assistant teacher, a general assistant, and a director. Thanks to the support of all those who have donated to our project we are able to preserve the Fiona Sargeant legacy. Our top priority is to facilitate classes in a safe environment for both teacher and learners and to provide an extramural activity which is good for both mind and body.

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The Directors Report:

Students began dance classes and returned to school on the 15th of January of 2025. Nqaba and Aviwe got back down to basics over the two weeks that was left of the month.

Last year on the last day of classes we lifted the mats as there appeared to be a few places where the boards had lifted slightly. It was a good thing to do because it also allowed the boards to be aired and dry out any moisture which may have accumulated. A few days later we noticed that the floor had settled back down and just before opening the school this year we drilled in a few more screws and laid the mats back down.
